Please accept this Memorandum and attachments as the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners' request pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 12-3.1 for a consultation regarding proposed rules that would change and/or increase certain fees charged to dentists by the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners.

First, the Board proposes to amend 21 NCAC 16Q .0201(a) to provide that a dentist seeking a general anesthesia permit must pay a \$475 fee. This fee covers the cost of the application and the inspection and evaluation of the dentist's facility. Under the current rule, the dentist must pay a \$100 application fee and a \$375 evaluation fee. The proposed new rule combines the existing \$100 application fee and \$375 evaluation fee into a single \$475 fee. The bottom line cost to the applicant is the same.

Second, the Board proposes to amend 21 NCAC 16Q .0204(b) to require a \$375 inspection fee for each satellite location at which a dentist will administer general anesthesia. Current rule 21 NCAC 16Q .0204(b) imposes a \$275 fee for the inspection of each additional location. The proposed amendment would effectively increase the cost for inspection of satellite facilities by \$100 per site.

Third, the Board proposes to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0206, which will impose a \$100 application fee for dentists who wish to obtain a mobile general anesthesia permit to provide general anesthesia or sedation services at the office of another practitioner.

Fourth, the Board proposes to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0207, which will impose a \$100 renewal fee for mobile general anesthesia permits and a \$100 late fee for permits that are

not renewed by January 31 of each year. The mobile general anesthesia permit is a new permit and there are, therefore, no counterparts to these regulations in the existing rules.

Fifth, the Board proposes to amend 21 NCAC 16Q .0301 to impose a \$375 application fee for dentists applying for a moderate conscious sedation permit. This fee covers the application fee and the cost of evaluating the dentist and inspecting his or her main office. The Board also proposes to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0306, which would impose a \$375 inspection fee for each additional location at which the dentist will administer moderate conscious sedation.

Under the current rules, a dentist applying for a moderate conscious sedation permit must pay a \$100 application fee and \$275 for each site inspection. See Rule 16Q .0301(a) and 16Q .0303(a). Therefore, if the proposed amendments are passed, the cost to an applicant seeking a moderate conscious sedation permit will effectively remain the same, except that the amended rule would increase the cost of satellite office inspections by \$100 per site.

The Board also plans to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0305, which imposes a \$100 renewal fee and a \$100 late fee for moderate conscious sedation permits that are not renewed by January 31 of each year. Current rule 21 NCAC 16Q .0501, which is slated for repeal, imposes a \$100 renewal fee and a \$100 late fee for moderate conscious sedation permits. Adoption of the proposed rule would not effectively increase the renewal or late fee.

Sixth, the Board seeks to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0404(a) which will require applicants for a moderate pediatric conscious sedation permit to pay a \$375 fee. This fee covers the cost of the application, the evaluation of the dentist and the inspection of the applicant's main office. The Board also seeks to adopt 21 NCAC 16Q .0408, which imposes a \$375 fee for the inspection of each additional location at which the dentist will administer moderate pediatric conscious sedation.

Under current Rule 16Q .0301(a), a dentist applying for a moderate pediatric conscious sedation permit must pay a \$100 application fee, plus \$275 for each site inspection. See 16Q .0303(a). Therefore, if the proposed amendments are passed, the cost to an applicant seeking a moderate pediatric conscious sedation permit will effectively remain the same, except that the new Rule 16Q .0404 would increase the cost of satellite office inspections by \$100 per site.

Lastly, the Board seeks to adopt Rule 16Q .0407, which will impose a \$100 renewal fee and a \$100 late fee for holders of moderate pediatric conscious sedation who do not renew their permits on a timely basis. Current rule 21 NCAC 16Q .0501, which is slated for repeal, imposes a \$100 renewal fee and a \$100 late fee for moderate pediatric conscious sedation permits. Adoption of the proposed rule would not effectively increase the renewal or late fee.

## Statutory Authority for Fees

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-39(11), the Board may charge up to \$750 for office inspections for general anesthesia or sedation. Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-39(12), the Dental Board may charge up to \$100 for each application for a general anesthesia or sedation permit.

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-39(12) the Board may charge up to \$100 for each renewal of a general anesthesia or sedation permit. Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-39(2a), the Board may charge up to \$100 for the late renewal of any license or permit.

### Reason For Requested Fee Increases

The Board requests the fee regulations to help defray the expenses incurred by the Dental Board in conducting the inspections and evaluations of the facilities where anesthesia and sedation is administered. The Board has to hire at least one dentist who has a current anesthesia or sedation permit to conduct each evaluation or inspection.

Copies of the rules with the proposed amendments are attached. We recently submitted these rules to the Office of Administrative Hearings/Rules Division for publication.
