# JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON JUDICIAL REFORM AND REDISTRICTING

Section 1. The Joint Select Committee on Judicial Reform and Redistricting (hereinafter "Committee") is established by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to G.S. 120-19.6(a1), Rule 31 of the Rules of the Senate of the 2017 General Assembly, and Rule 26(a) of the Rules of the House of Representatives of the 2017 General Assembly.

Section 2. The Committee consists of 30 members. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint 15 Senators to the Committee. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 15 Representatives to the Committee. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each appoint co-chairs from among their respective appointees. A co-chair or other member of the Committee continues to serve until a successor is appointed. Members serve at the pleasure of the appointing officer.

#### Section 3. The Committee may examine:

- (1) Reforms to the State's judicial system
- (2) Redistricting as it relates to the State's judicial districts
- (3) The present and future judicial needs of the State's population
- (4) Any other judicial reform or judicial redistricting issue
- Section 4. The Committee shall meet upon the call of its House and Senate cochairs. A quorum of the Committee is a majority of its members. No action may be taken except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present.
- Section 5. The Committee, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and Article 5A of Chapter 120 of the General Statutes. The Committee may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services, as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.
- Section 6. Members of the Committee shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowance as provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5 and 138-6, as appropriate.
- Section 7. The expenses of the Committee shall be considered expenses incurred for the joint operation of the General Assembly. Individual expenses of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or less, including per diem, travel, and subsistence expenses of members of the Committee, and clerical expenses shall be paid upon the authorization of a co-chair of the Committee. Individual expenses in excess of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) shall be paid upon the written approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. All expenses of the Committee shall be paid from the Legislative Services Commission's Reserve for Studies.
- Section 8. The Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist the Committee in its work. The Director of Legislative Assistants of the House of Representatives and the Director of Legislative Assistants of the Senate shall assign clerical support staff to the Committee.
- Section 9. The Committee may meet at various locations around the State in order to promote greater public participation in its deliberations.
- Section 10. The Committee may submit an interim or final report on the results of its work, including any proposed legislation, to the members of the Senate and the House of Representatives prior to the convening of, or during, any session of the General Assembly convening in 2018 by filing a copy of the report with the Office of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Office of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Legislative Library. The Committee shall terminate upon the convening of the 2019 General Assembly or upon the filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.







# JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON JUDICIAL REFORM AND REDISTRICTING (2017) January 11, 2018 Room 544 of the Legislative Office Building

The Joint Select Committee on Judicial Reform and Redistricting (2017) met on Thursday, January 11, 2018 at 1:00 PM. The meeting was held in Room 544 of the Legislative Office Building. Members present were: Representatives Burr, Lewis, Blust, Davis, Grange, Duane Hall, Destin Hall, Jackson, John, Jordan, Reives, Richardson, Rogers and Stevens; Senators Bishop, Daniel, Rabon, Barret, Blue, Chaudhuri, Edwards, Ford, Hise, McKissick, Sanderson, Newton, Randleman and Van Duyn.

Representative Lewis, Co-Chair, presided.

Chairman Lewis called the meeting to order at 1:14 P.M. He thanked the Sergeant-at-Arms and central staff for preparation of the meeting. He announced the meeting would adjourn at or before 4 P.M. and that all materials were available on committee website. Senator Newton was recognized for opening remarks and an explanation of selection models.

Gus Willis, NCGA Central Staff, gave an overview of the history and summary of the appellate judges' appointment procedure in S971, Session 1995, followed by Senator Newton giving an overview of the election and balanced plan for independence and accountability.

Senator Newton presented on merit selection ideas and answered a series of questions from Representative Jackson related to the elimination of the Missouri model. Chairman Lewis explained that Senator Newton was informing the Committee on issues the Senate Committee had discussed and that the Missouri model was not given favorable feedback from the Senate. Representative Jackson questioned if the slides explaining the merit selection models of South Carolina and Virginia were indicative of what North Carolina would adopt, and asked who could be referred to the Governor for judgeships. Representative Reives asked questions pertaining to qualifications and criteria of nominees. Senator McKissick commented on politicized elections versus merit selection. Senator Chaudhuri questioned the balance of equities, the appointment procedure for the General Assembly and the Merit Selection Committee, and procedures for appointments when the General Assembly was not in session. Representative Blust stated an area of concern about single party control regarding appointments.

Chairman Lewis qualified the information Senator Newton had expressed as an example of how the process could look and there was no written bill that addresses the issue of who would



appoint the selection committee. He advised the important issues of diversity in all areas had not been discussed, nor specifics of the role the Legislature would play.

Senator Ford asked for diversity of race, sex, age and religion on nominating or selecting committees to insure the courts are reflective of the communities they serve. Representative Jackson commented on the lack of eligibility for reappointment. Senator Van Duyn acknowledged concerns regarding the commission's need to be diverse.

Representative Stevens was recognized for a statement about the establishment of the Committee and the need for some type of judicial reform. Chairman Lewis responded that the Committee had been tasked with considering the issue and there was no prediction on the outcome, and the committee would decide by a majority vote. Representative Jordan questioned if a non-partisan, independent merit commission would be set up in advance of any vacancy, along with the local independent merit selection committees. Senator Sanderson asked if there was a cap on the number of candidates that could be sent to the General Assembly. Representative Jackson asked if there was a minimum number of candidates to be nominated. Senator McKissick asked for a timeline for the Committee and how a consensus would be reached.

Senator Chaudhuri asked if feedback had been received from stakeholders for the "purple plan". Senator Van Duyn asked what problem was trying to be fixed. Senator Newton advised that the Committee was to determine if there was a better model to insure excellence in the Judiciary in North Carolina. Senator Daniel voiced concerns about the appellate judge selection when a vacancy occurs.

Chairman Lewis recognized Representative Burr to explain proposed map options, including HB717 which was passed by the House. He identified problems found, the corrections and the differences in HB717 and Senate proposal that were to be considered.

Senator Bishop, Co-Chair, presided in Chairman Lewis' absence. Senator Ford questioned the location of the maps on the website. Senator Blue asked for the number of districts in the original Bell plan effective in 1968, the reasons for additional districts in the proposals, and services needed. Senator McKissick suggested considering statewide population and the use of other criteria to produce maps. Representative Burr explained the process involved in present maps and invited Senator McKissick to bring forth proposals.

Representative Jackson questioned the voting fairness in districts and if any current district court districts are unconstitutional and pending lawsuits. Representative Duane Hall asked the Committee to keep in mind the double-bunked judges. Representative Burr asked to be provided the names of double-bunked judges and the source of such a list. Representative Daune Hall will submit a list to the Committee.

Senator Hise admonished the addresses of judges are protected information. Chairman Bishop stated it would be taken under advisement if data is remitted to the Committee Chairs.



Representative Jordan asked about residency districts in the Senate plan and how discussions were going forward. Senator Chaudhuri questioned the number of stakeholders supporting the plan and how the maps were drawn. Representative John asked for the number of judges contacted before beginning work, criteria used in drawing maps, if race of incumbent judges was considered, and if elections results were used in proposed districts. Representative Reives questioned staff if districts are subject to the Voting Rights Act. Central staff attorney Erika Churchill explained the situations observed. Senator Bishop summarized the steps that had been taken to date. Representative Burr stated that concerns brought forward had been addressed. Chairman Bishop presented the Committee with information that was being worked on presently by staff.

Senator Van Duyn asked about election of multiple judges county-wide. Representative Stevens called a point of order on assumptions stated by Senator Van Duyn. Representative Burr replied there was no request to remove election sub-districts. Senator Van Duyn questioned work load, urban versus rural definition, and said she will submit data to the Committee related to her concerns.

Representative Jackson asked if the State was part of the Consent Decree discussed earlier and Erika Churchill asked for time to research.

Senator Blue questioned date compilation of information provided by AOC and its reliability. Senator Bishop offered the study done by AOC had updated information as recently as July 2017. Representative Burr stated there should not be two additional election cycles without making changes. Senator McKissick suggested a second look at disposition rates by AOC.

Senator Barrett stated the data used from AOC currently allows for assignment of judges. Senator Randleman stated that the AOC workload data is reliable and used for determining staffing based on filings and dispositions.

Erika Churchill reported on the Consent Decree filed on November 25, 1987: Kelly Alexander, et al, Plaintiff, vs. James G. Martin, el al, Defendant. Representative Jackson asked if changes to maps would need to ask courts if decree be terminated. Erika Churchill answered that further study would be needed for clarity. She stated that since that time the General Assembly has made changes to the maps.

Discussion was offered by Chairman Bishop. Senator Chaudhuri asked how long it would take the Committee to reach a resolution. Chairman Bishop answered that was not known and members would help to make that decision. Representative Blust asked for clarification on the maps that were to be considered. Chairman Bishop stated that for legislation to move forward the bill would have to move out of Senate Rules Committee for the Senate to rule. Representative Blust expressed a concern on merit selection and who gets to decide merit, and restoration of primaries for judge races.



There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 3:50 P.M.


OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 971 from the 1995 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly would have, subject to voter approval, amended the North Carolina Constitution to provide for appointment of justices and judges of the North Carolina Supreme Court and Court of Appeals by the Governor upon confirmation by joint resolution of the General Assembly. Justices and judges seeking to continue service beyond their initial appointment would have been required to file notice with the State Board of Elections and stand for retention in a non-partisan retention election for an additional 8 year term.

#### **BILL ANALYSIS:**

Senate Bill 971 from the 1995 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly would have, subject to voter approval, amended the North Carolina Constitution to set forth an appointment procedure and nonpartisan retention election process for justices of the North Carolina Supreme Court and judges of the North Carolina Court of Appeals as follows:

- Nomination of a candidate to fill a vacancy by the Governor.
  - o The Governor may withdraw the nomination at any time.
- Confirmation by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly
  - The legislative committee to which confirmation is referred may conduct investigation of the nominee to include evaluation of any of the following with regard to the nominee:
    - Ethical conduct
    - Knowledge and application of the law
    - Management of the courts over which the nominee has presided
    - Work habits
    - Health
    - Judicial demeanor
  - o The legislative committee may inspect files of the Judicial Standards Commission upon request of the committee chairperson.
  - Each house of the General Assembly must vote on confirmation within 60 calendar days of the nomination, except when the nomination is made when the General Assembly is not in regular session, in which case the Governor may call a one-day extra session

during which only the nomination may be considered; the nomination may not be confirmed in any other extra session.

#### • Term of Office Upon Appointment

o The term of office by appointment as Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge would extend through June 30 after the next statewide election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 18 months after the nomination is confirmed.

#### Nonpartisan Retention Election

- A justice or judge wishing to continue service beyond the initial term must file notice with the State Board of Elections (SBOE) by noon on the first business day of July in the year of the election.
- O The retention election must be conducted and canvassed in accordance with rules of the SBOE in the same general manner as general elections, except that the retention election is nonpartisan and must be placed at the top of the ballot above all other elections or matters for decision, whether partisan, nonpartisan, or otherwise.
- Upon a majority of votes cast on the issue of retention, the regular term of a justice or judge is 8 years. If the voters fail to approve retention, the vacancy would be filled by nomination and confirmation as set forth above, but the Governor may only nominate a person of the same political affiliation as the justice or judge who has not been retained.

#### • Transition Provisions

The term of office for a judge or justice elected before January 1, 1996 for a term that extended beyond January 1, 1996, and would have been in office on January 1, 1996, would have been extended through June 30 of the year following the eighth year after such justice or judge was last elected to office. If that person continued to serve the remainder of that term, they could have stood for retention in the office for a succeeding regular term.

**BACKGROUND:** Senate Bill 971 passed the Senate on July 6, 1995 but failed to pass second reading in the House of Representatives on July 27, 1995. Provisions contained in the bill providing for election of superior court judges within their districts (instead of statewide, as was the law at that time) and for filling vacancies in certain superior court districts were enacted in 1996 via S.L. 2016-9es2.

#### Overview of Senate Bill 971, 1995 Session

Vacancy occurs in the office of Chief Justice or Associate Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court or Judge of the North Carolina Court of Appeals.

Governor nominates a person to fill the vacancy.

Legislative committee may conduct an investigation of the nominee and may inspect files of the Judicial Standards Commission.

The nominee is confirmed by passage of a joint resolution of the General Assembly. Each house confirms by a majority of members present and voting.

If the General Assembly is in regular session, each house must vote on the confirmation within 60 calendar days of the nomination.

If the General Assembly is not in regular session, the Governor may call a one-day extra session to consider only the nomination.

The appointee serves a term of office extending through June 30 after the next statewide election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 18 months after the confirmation.

The appointee files notice indicating desire to continue service byond initial term.

#### A nonpartisan retention election is held.

If majority of votes cast on the issue approve retention, the appointee serves a regular eight year term.

If majority of the votes cast are not in favor of retention, office becomes vacant at end of term.

Governor must then nominate a person of the same political affiliation as the justice or judge not retained.

\*Per S.L. 2015-241 (HB 97, 2015 Appropriations Act), 2 of the 12 special superior court judgeships will be abolished on or before 12/31/2017.







A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF NORTH CAROLINA TO PROVIDE 2 FOR GUBERNATORIAL NOMINATION OF JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME 3 COURT AND JUDGES OF THE COURT OF APPEALS, LEGISLATIVE 4 CONFIRMATION, AND RETENTION BY VOTE OF THE PEOPLE, TO 5 PROVIDE FOR ELECTION OF SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES WITHIN THEIR 6 DISTRICTS, AND TO IMPROVE THE ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE AND 7 PROMOTE JUDICIAL ECONOMY AND EFFICIENCY WITHIN THE SUPERIOR 8 COURT DIVISION OF THE GENERAL COURT OF JUSTICE BY PROVIDING 9 FOR FULL EIGHT-YEAR TERMS OF OFFICE WHEN VACANCIES ARISE AND 10 AN ELECTION IS HELD OTHER THAN AT THE EXPIRATION OF THE PRIOR 11 TERM FOR CERTAIN SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Section 16 of Article IV of the North Carolina Constitution reads as rewritten:

"Sec. 16. Terms of office and election of Justices of the Supreme Court, Judges of the Court of Appeals, and Judges of the Superior Court. Selection and tenure of Justices of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Court of Appeals; election of Judges of the Superior Court.

Justices of the Supreme Court, Judges of the Court of Appeals, and regular (1) Judges of the Superior court shall be elected by the qualified voters and shall hold office for terms of eight years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Justices of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Court of Appeals shall be elected by the qualified voters of the State. Regular Judges of the Superior Court may shall be elected by the qualified voters of the State or by the voters of their respective districts, as the General Assembly may prescribe. districts.

- (2) General principles. Justices and judges of the Appellate Division should be selected for and continue to hold office solely upon the basis of personal and professional fitness to administer right and justice wisely, according to law, and without favor, denial, or delay, to all persons who come into the courts. While their continuation in office should be periodically subject to approval by the people, both their initial selection and continuation in office should be free, so far as may be, from the influences and necessities of partisan political activity.
- (3) Nomination, confirmation, appointment retention election, and terms of justices and judges. On and after January 1, 1996, when a vacancy occurs in the office of Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division, the Governor shall nominate a person to fill the vacancy. Prior to appointment, such nominations by the Governor shall be subject to confirmation of the General Assembly by a majority of the members of each house present and voting prior to appointment. For the purposes of this section, creation of a new judgeship within the Appellate Division creates a vacancy.

Each house of the General Assembly shall vote on confirmation within 60 calendar days of the date of nomination, except that no day shall be included within that calculation if it is:

- (a) Between sine die adjournment of one regular session and convening of the next regular session; or
- (b) During any period when the General Assembly has adjourned a regular session for more than 30 days jointly as provided under Section 20 of Article II of this Constitution.

If a nomination is made during either of the periods listed in subdivision (a) or (b) of this subsection, the Governor may convene the General Assembly in extra session for the purpose of considering confirmation of the nomination. No action of that extra session shall be valid after the second calendar day of that session, and that extra session may not consider any matters other than rules for the extra session, confirmation of the nomination, and adjournment sine die. The nomination may not be confirmed in any extra session other than one called under this subsection.

The term of office by appointment as Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division extends through June 30 after the next statewide election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 18 months after the nomination is confirmed. At that election, a person holding by appointment the office of Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division who desires to continue in office shall be subject to approval by nonpartisan ballot, by a majority of the votes cast on the issue of the Justice's or Judge's retention. A Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division then approved for retention serves a regular term.

The regular term of office of the Chief Justice, Associate Justices, and Judges of the Appellate Division is eight years and expires on June 30.

At the last statewide election for members of the General Assembly held before the expiration of a regular term of office, a Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division who desires to continue in office shall be subject to approval by nonpartisan ballot, by a majority of the votes cast on the issue of the Justice's or Judge's retention.

If the voters fail to approve the retention in office of a Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division serving an appointed or regular term, the office shall become vacant at the end of the term of office, and it shall be filled by nomination, confirmation, and appointment as prescribed in this section. In such case, the Governor may only nominate a person of the same political affiliation as the justice or judge who has not been retained in office. For the purpose of this section, the political affiliation of a nominee for justice or judge is determined as of 24 months preceding the date of the vacancy for which the nomination is made.

Voting in a retention election on the Chief Justice, Associate Justices, and Judges of the Appellate Division shall be the qualified voters of the whole State.

(4) Transition provisions. The term of office of a person who has been elected before January 1, 1996, to the office of Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division for a term which extends beyond January 1, 1996, and who is in office on January 1, 1996, is extended through June 30 of the year following the eighth year after the date any such justice or judge was last elected to the office. If the person so elected continues to serve for the remainder of the term, that person may stand for retention in the office for a succeeding regular term as provided in this section. If the person continues to serve for the remainder of the term but does not stand for retention election, a vacancy is created in the office upon expiration of the term, and this vacancy shall be filled by nomination, confirmation, and appointment as provided in this section.

The term of office of a person who has been appointed before January 1, 1996, to the office of Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge of the Appellate Division for a term which extends beyond January 1, 1996, and who is in office on January 1, 1996, shall end on June 30, 1999. If the person so appointed continues to serve for the remainder of the term, that person may stand for retention in the office for a regular term as provided by this section at the statewide election for members of the General Assembly held in 1998.

Upon the death, resignation, removal, or retirement of any incumbent justice or judge on or after January 1, 1996, and before the expiration of his term of office, the resulting

vacancy shall be filled by nomination, confirmation, and appointment as provided in this section.

Vacancies in judicial offices in the Appellate Division occurring before January 1, 1996, and not filled by that date, shall be filled by nomination, confirmation, and appointment as provided in this section.

From the date any incumbent described in this subsection is continued in office by retention vote for a term next succeeding the term in progress on January 1, 1996, or is succeeded in office by another person, the office is held subject to the provisions of this section.

(5) The General Assembly may implement this section by general law."

Sec. 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at a statewide election on November 7, 1995, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The reasonable additional costs of conducting the election shall be reimbursed by the State. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:

## "[] FOR [] AGAINST

Constitutional amendment to replace the present practice of selecting justices and judges of the Appellate Division by gubernatorial appointment, followed by partisan elections, with a method by which justices and judges of the Appellate Division will be nominated by the Governor, confirmed by the General Assembly, and then serve for limited terms after which the question of the justice's or judge's retention in office is regularly submitted for approval or disapproval by nonpartisan vote of the people at general elections, and to provide for election of superior court judges in their districts."

- Sec. 3. If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the Secretary of State. The amendment becomes effective upon this certification. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office.
- Sec. 3.1. Chapter 7A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read:

### "ARTICLE 1A.

## "APPOINTMENT AND CONFIRMATION OF JUSTICES AND JUDGES, RETENTION ELECTIONS.

# "§ 7A-4.1. Nomination of justices and judges by Governor and confirmation by General Assembly.

- (a) The office of Chief Justice and Justice of the Supreme Court and Judge of the Court of Appeals are filled by nomination by the Governor subject to confirmation by the General Assembly in accordance with Section 16 of Article IV of the Constitution.
- (b) Nominees are subject to confirmation as provided in this subsection. A nominee is confirmed by passage of a joint resolution of the General Assembly. The Governor may withdraw a nomination at any time.
- "§ 7A-4.2. Confirmation procedures.

(a) A legislative committee to which the issue of confirmation is referred may conduct an investigation of the nominee. The investigation may include an evaluation of the nominee's ethical conduct, the nominee's knowledge of and application of the law, the nominee's management of the courts over which he has presided, the nominee's work habits, the nominee's health, and the nominee's judicial demeanor. The nominee or judge shall be given an opportunity to present to the committee any information that the nominee determines to be appropriate.

(b) The committee shall be allowed to inspect the files of the Judicial Standards Commission by request of the chairman of the committee. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 7A-377, the files of the Judicial Standards Commission shall be made available to the committee. Testimony and other evidence presented to the committee is privileged in any action for defamation.

"§ 7A-4.3. Governor to issue commissions to justices and judges.

Every person duly nominated by the Governor as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, or Judge of the Court of Appeals and duly confirmed by the General Assembly shall be appointed by the Governor and shall procure from the Governor a commission attesting that fact, which the Governor shall issue upon receipt of a certification by the Secretary of State of the joint resolution of confirmation.

When a judge is retained in office by vote of the people, the Governor shall issue a commission attesting that fact, which the Governor shall issue upon receipt of a certification by the Secretary of State of the results of the election.

"8 7A-4.4. No elections in 1996.

No partisan election as previously provided by law for Chief Justice or Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, or Judge of the Court of Appeals, shall be held in 1996 or thereafter.

"§ 7A-4.5. Retention elections.

- (a) As provided by Section 16 of Article IV of the Constitution of North Carolina, a Chief Justice or Associate Justice of the Supreme Court or Judge of the Court of Appeals desiring to continue in office shall be subject to approval by nonpartisan ballot, by a majority of votes cast on the issue of the justice's or judge's retention.
- (b) A person subject to subsection (a) of this section shall indicate the desire to continue in office by filing a notice to that effect with the State Board of Elections no later than 12:00 noon on the first business day of July in the year of the election. The notice shall be on a form approved by the State Board of Elections. Notice can be withdrawn at any time prior to the deadline for filing notice under this subsection.
- (c) Retention elections shall be conducted and canvassed in accordance with rules of the State Board of Elections in the same general manner as general elections under Chapter 163 of the General Statutes, except that the retention election is nonpartisan. The form of the ballot shall be determined by the State Board of Elections.
- (d) Retention elections shall be placed at the top of the ballot above all other elections or matters for decision, whether partisan, nonpartisan, or otherwise.
- (e) If a person who has filed a notice calling a retention election dies or is removed from office prior to the time that the ballots are printed, the retention election is

cancelled. If a person who has filed a notice calling a retention election dies or is removed from office after the ballots are printed, the State Board of Elections may cancel the election if it determines that the ballots can be reprinted without significant expense. If the ballots cannot be reprinted, then the results of the election shall be ineffective."

Sec. 3.2. (a) Chapter 7A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

### 8 7A-41.2. Nomination and election of regular superior court judges.

Candidates for the office of regular superior court judge shall be both nominated and elected by the qualified voters of the superior court district for which the election is sought."

- G.S. 163-1 is amended in the table by deleting the word "State" in the column (b) entitled "Jurisdiction" under the entry for "Judges of the superior courts", and substituting "Superior Court District".
  - (c) G.S. 163-140(a) reads as rewritten:
- Kinds of General Election Ballots; Right to Combine. For purposes of general elections, there shall be seven kinds of official ballots entitled:
  - Ballot for presidential electors (1)
  - (2) Ballot for United States Senator
  - (3) Ballot for member of the United States House of Representatives
  - (4) State ballot
  - (5)County ballot
  - Repealed by Session Laws 1973, c. 793, s. 56. (6)
  - Ballot for constitutional amendments and other propositions submitted (7) to the people.

Use of official ballots shall be limited to the purposes indicated by their titles. The printing on all ballots shall be plain and legible but, unless large type is specified by this section, type larger than 10-point shall not be used in printing ballots. All general election ballots shall be prepared in such a way as to leave sufficient blank space beneath each name printed thereon in which a voter may conveniently write the name of any person for whom he may desire to vote.

Unless prohibited by this section, the board of elections, State or county, charged by law with printing ballots may, in its discretion, combine any two or more official ballots. Whenever two or more ballots are combined, the voting instructions for the State ballot set out in subsection (b)(4) of this section shall be used, except that if the two ballots being combined do not contain a multi-seat race, then the second sentence of instruction b. shall not appear on the ballot.

Contests in the general election for seats in the State House of Representatives and State Senate shall be on ballots that are separate from ballots containing non-legislative contests, except where the voting system used makes separation of ballots impractical. State House and State Senate contests shall be on the same ballot, unless one is a singleseat contest and the other a multi-seat contest.

If the State Board of Elections divides the State ballot into two or more ballots, all 42 ---All candidates for superior court shall appear on the same ballot except that the State

The name or names of each political party's candidate or candidates for each office listed on the ballot shall be printed in the appropriate office section of the proper party column, and the names of unaffiliated candidates shall be printed in the appropriate office section of the column headed 'Unaffiliated Candidates.' At the left of each name shall be printed a voting square, and in each column all voting squares shall be arranged in a perpendicular line.

On the face of the ballot, above the party and unaffiliated column division, the following instructions shall be printed in heavy black type, and the words 'you must also' in instruction c. shall be underlined:

- 'a. To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket), make a cross (X) mark in the circle of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.
- b. You may vote a split ticket by not marking a cross (X) mark in the party circle, but by making a cross (X) mark in the square opposite the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.
- c. You may also vote a split ticket by marking a cross (X) mark in the party circle and then making a cross (X) mark in the square

opposite the name of any candidate you choose of a different party. In any multi-seat race where a party circle is marked and you vote for candidates of another party, you must also make a cross (X) mark opposite the name of any candidate you choose of the party for which you marked the party circle to assure your vote will count.

d. If you tear or deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it and get another.'

On the bottom of the ballot shall be printed an identified facsimile of the signature of the Chairman of the State Board of Elections. If the State ballot contains no multi-seat race, then the second sentence of instruction b. shall not appear on the ballot."

- (e) G.S. 163-140(b)(5) reads as rewritten:
- County Ballot: Beneath the title and general instructions set out in this subsection, the ballot for single-seat contests for county officers (including district attorney for the prosecutorial district in which the county is situated, district judge for the district court district in which the county is situated, regular resident superior court judge for the superior court district in which the county or part thereof is situated, and members of the General Assembly in the senatorial and representative districts in which the county is situated), and for all county offices where mechanical voting machines are used, shall be divided into parallel columns separated by distinct black lines. The county board of elections shall assign a separate column to each political party having candidates for the offices on the ballot and one to unaffiliated candidates, if any. At the head of each party column the party's name shall be printed in large type and at the head of the column for unaffiliated candidates shall be printed in large type the words 'Unaffiliated Candidates.' The name or names of each political party's candidate or candidates for each office listed on the ballot shall be printed in the appropriate office section of the proper party column, and the names of unaffiliated candidates shall be printed in the appropriate office section of the

column headed 'Unaffiliated Candidates.' At the left of each name shall be printed a voting square, and in each column all voting squares shall be arranged in a perpendicular line.

On the face of the ballot, above the party and unaffiliated column division, the following instructions shall be printed in heavy black type, and the words 'you must also' in instruction c. shall be underlined:

- 'a. To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket), make a cross (X) mark in the circle of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.
- b. You may vote a split ticket by not marking a cross (X) mark in the party circle, but by making a cross (X) mark in the square opposite the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.
- c. You may also vote a split ticket by marking a cross (X) mark in the party circle and then making a cross (X) mark in the square opposite the name of any candidate you choose of a different party. On the bottom of the ballot shall be printed an identified facsimile of the signature of the chairman of the county board of elections. If the county ballot contains no multi-seat race, then the second sentence of instruction b. shall not appear on the ballot."

(f) G.S. 163-192 reads as rewritten:

# "§ 163-192. State Board of Elections to prepare abstracts and declare results of primaries and elections.

- (a) After Primary. At the conclusion of its canvass of the primary election, the State Board of Elections shall prepare separate abstracts of the votes cast:
  - (1) For Governor and all State officers, justices of the Supreme Court, judges of the Court of Appeals, judges of the superior court, and United States Senators.
  - (2) For members of the United States House of Representatives for the several congressional districts in the State.
  - (3) For district court judges for the several district court districts in the State.
  - (3a) For superior court judges for the several superior court districts in the State.

  - (2) For Governor and all State officers, justices of the Supreme Court, judges of the Court of Appeals, judges of the superior court, and United States Senators.
  - (3) For members of the United States House of Representatives for the several congressional districts in the State.
  - (4) For district court judges for the several district court districts as defined in G.S. 7A-133 in the State.
  - (4a) For superior court judges for the several superior court districts in the State.
  - (5) For district attorney in the several prosecutorial districts in the State.
  - (6) For State Senators in the several senatorial districts in the State composed of more than one county.
  - (7) For members of the State House of Representatives in the several representative districts in the State composed of more than one county.
  - (8) For and against any constitutional amendments or propositions submitted to the people.

Abstracts prepared by the State Board of Elections under this subsection shall state the names of all persons voted for, the office for which each received votes, and the number of legal ballots cast for each candidate for each office canvassed by the State Board of Elections. They shall also state the name or names of the person or persons whom the State Board of Elections shall ascertain and judicially determine by the count to be elected to each office.

Abstracts prepared under this subsection shall be signed by the members of the State Board of Elections in their official capacity and shall have the great seal of the State affixed thereto.

(c) Disposition of Abstracts of Returns. – The State Board of Elections shall file with the Secretary of State the original abstracts of returns prepared by it under the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section, and also the duplicate county abstracts transmitted to the State Board of Elections under the provisions of G.S. 163-

177. Upon the request of the Legislative Services Office, the Secretary of State shall submit a copy of the original abstracts to that Office."

Sec. 3.3. For the purpose of Section 1 of this act, terms of justices and judges covered by Section 2 of Chapter 98 of the 1995 Session Laws are as provided by that act.

Sec. 3.4. G.S. 7A-10(a) reads as rewritten:

The Supreme Court shall consist of a Chief Justice and six associate justices, "(a) elected by the qualified voters of the State for terms of eight years selected as provided by Article 1A of this Chapter. Before entering upon the duties of his office, each justice shall take an oath of office. Four justices shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the court. Sessions of the court shall be held in the city of Raleigh, and scheduled by rule of court so as to discharge expeditiously the court's business."

Effective January 1, 1969, the number of judges is increased to nine, and the Governor, on or after March 1, 1969, shall make temporary appointments to the additional judgeships thus created. The appointees shall serve until January 1, 1971. Their successors shall be elected at the general election for members of the General Assembly in November, 1970, and shall take office on January 1, 1971, to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term which began on January 1, 1969.

Effective January 1, 1977, the number of judges is increased to 12; and the Governor, on or after July 1, 1977, shall make temporary appointments to the additional judgeships thus created. The appointees shall serve until January 1, 1979. Their successors shall be elected at the general election for members of the General Assembly in November, 1978, and shall take office on January 1, 1979, to serve the remainder of the unexpired term which began on January 1, 1977.

The Court of Appeals shall consist of 12 judges, selected as provided in Article 1A of this Chapter. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall designate one of the judges as Chief Judge to serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the Chief Justice. Before entering upon the duties of his office, a judge of the Court of Appeals shall take the oath of office prescribed for a judge of the General Court of Justice.

The Court of Appeals shall sit in panels of three judges each. The Chief Judge insofar as practicable shall assign the members to panels in such fashion that each member sits a substantially equal number of times with each other member. He shall preside over the panel of which he is a member, and shall designate the presiding judge of the other panel or panels.

Three judges shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the court, except as may be provided in G.S. 7A-32.

In the event the Chief Judge is unable, on account of absence or temporary incapacity, to perform the duties placed upon him as Chief Judge, the Chief Justice shall appoint an acting Chief Judge from the other judges of the Court, to temporarily discharge the duties of Chief Judge."

Sec. 3.6. G.S. 163-106(c) reads as rewritten:

"(c) Time for Filing Notice of Candidacy. — Candidates seeking party primary nominations for the following offices shall file their notice of candidacy with the State Board of Elections no earlier than 12:00 noon on the first Monday in January and no later than 12:00 noon on the first Monday in February preceding the primary:

Upon the request of the Legislative Services Office, the Secretary of State shall submit a copy of the original abstracts to that Office."

Sec. 3.13. G.S. 163-194 reads as rewritten:

### "§ 163-194. Governor to issue commissions to certain elected officials.

Every person duly elected to one of the offices listed below, upon obtaining a certificate of his election from the Secretary of State under the provisions of G.S. 163-193, shall procure from the Governor a commission attesting his election to the specified office, which the Governor shall issue upon production of the Secretary of State's certificate:

Members of the United States House of Representatives,

Justices, Judges, and Superior Court Judges, District Court Judges and District Attorneys of the General Court of Justice."

Sec. 3.14. G.S. 163-1 is amended in the table by deleting the entries for "Justices and Judges of the Appellate Division".

Sec. 3.15. G.S. 163-9 reads as rewritten:

### "§ 163-9. Filling vacancies in State and-district judicial offices.

Vacancies occurring in the offices of Justice of the Supreme Court, judge of the Court of Appeals, and office of judge of the superior court for causes other than expiration of term shall be filled by appointment of the Governor. An appointee shall hold his place until the next election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 60 days after the vacancy occurs, at which time an election shall be held to fill the unexpired term of the office: Provided, that when the unexpired term of the office in which the vacancy has occurred expires on the first day of January succeeding the next election for members of the General Assembly, the Governor shall appoint to fill that vacancy for the unexpired term of the office.

Vacancies in the office of district judge which occur before the expiration of a term shall not be filled by election. Vacancies in the office of district judge shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 7A-142."

Sec. 3.16. Sections 3.1 through 3.15 of this act are effective only if the constitutional amendment proposed by Section 1 of this act is approved by the qualified voters in accordance with Section 2 of this act.

Sec. 3.17. G.S. 163-9 as rewritten by Chapter 98 of the 1995 Session Laws reads as rewritten:

### "§ 163-9. Filling vacancies in State and district judicial offices.

Vacancies occurring in the offices of Justice of the Supreme Court, judge of the Court of Appeals, and judge of the superior court for causes other than expiration of term shall be filled by appointment of the Governor. An appointee to the office of Justice of the Supreme Court or judge of the Court of Appeals shall hold office until January 1 next following the election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 60 days after the vacancy occurs, at which time an election shall be held for an eight-year term and until a successor is elected and qualified. When the unexpired term of the office in which the vacancy has occurred expires on the first day of January succeeding the next election for members of the General Assembly, the Governor shall appoint to fill that vacancy for the unexpired term of the office.

Vacancies in the office of district judge which occur before the expiration of a term shall not be filled by election. Vacancies in the office of district judge shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 7A-142.

- Appointees for judges of the superior court from any district: (b)
  - With only one resident judge; or (1)
  - In which no county is subject to section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of (2)1965,

shall hold the office until the next election of members of the General Assembly that is held more than 60 days after the vacancy occurs, at which time an election shall be held to fill an eight-year term."

OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 971 from the 1995 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly would have, subject to voter approval, amended the North Carolina Constitution to provide for appointment of justices and judges of the North Carolina Supreme Court and Court of Appeals by the Governor upon confirmation by joint resolution of the General Assembly. Justices and judges seeking to continue service beyond their initial appointment would have been required to file notice with the State Board of Elections and stand for retention in a non-partisan retention election for an additional 8 year term.

#### **BILL ANALYSIS:**

Senate Bill 971 from the 1995 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly would have, subject to voter approval, amended the North Carolina Constitution to set forth an appointment procedure and nonpartisan retention election process for justices of the North Carolina Supreme Court and judges of the North Carolina Court of Appeals as follows:

- Nomination of a candidate to fill a vacancy by the Governor.
  - o The Governor may withdraw the nomination at any time.
- Confirmation by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly
  - The legislative committee to which confirmation is referred may conduct investigation of the nominee to include evaluation of any of the following with regard to the nominee:
    - Ethical conduct
    - Knowledge and application of the law
    - Management of the courts over which the nominee has presided
    - Work habits
    - Health
    - Judicial demeanor
  - o The legislative committee may inspect files of the Judicial Standards Commission upon request of the committee chairperson.
  - o Each house of the General Assembly must vote on confirmation within 60 calendar days of the nomination, except when the nomination is made when the General Assembly is not in regular session, in which case the Governor may call a one-day extra session

### • Term of Office Upon Appointment

o The term of office by appointment as Chief Justice, Associate Justice, or Judge would extend through June 30 after the next statewide election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 18 months after the nomination is confirmed.

### Nonpartisan Retention Election

- A justice or judge wishing to continue service beyond the initial term must file notice with the State Board of Elections (SBOE) by noon on the first business day of July in the year of the election.
- O The retention election must be conducted and canvassed in accordance with rules of the SBOE in the same general manner as general elections, except that the retention election is nonpartisan and must be placed at the top of the ballot above all other elections or matters for decision, whether partisan, nonpartisan, or otherwise.
- Upon a majority of votes cast on the issue of retention, the regular term of a justice or judge is 8 years. If the voters fail to approve retention, the vacancy would be filled by nomination and confirmation as set forth above, but the Governor may only nominate a person of the same political affiliation as the justice or judge who has not been retained.

#### • Transition Provisions

The term of office for a judge or justice elected before January 1, 1996 for a term that extended beyond January 1, 1996, and would have been in office on January 1, 1996, would have been extended through June 30 of the year following the eighth year after such justice or judge was last elected to office. If that person continued to serve the remainder of that term, they could have stood for retention in the office for a succeeding regular term.

**BACKGROUND:** Senate Bill 971 passed the Senate on July 6, 1995 but failed to pass second reading in the House of Representatives on July 27, 1995. Provisions contained in the bill providing for election of superior court judges within their districts (instead of statewide, as was the law at that time) and for filling vacancies in certain superior court districts were enacted in 1996 via S.L. 2016-9es2.

### Overview of Senate Bill 971, 1995 Session

Vacancy occurs in the office of Chief Justice or Associate Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court or Judge of the North Carolina Court of Appeals.

Governor nominates a person to fill the vacancy.

Legislative committee may conduct an investigation of the nominee and may inspect files of the Judicial Standards Commission.

The nominee is confirmed by passage of a joint resolution of the General Assembly. Each house confirms by a majority of members present and voting.

If the General Assembly is in regular session, each house must vote on the confirmation within 60 calendar days of the nomination.

If the General Assembly is not in regular session, the Governor may call a one-day extra session to consider only the nomination.

The appointee serves a term of office extending through June 30 after the next statewide election for members of the General Assembly that is held more than 18 months after the confirmation.

The appointee files notice indicating desire to continue service byond initial term.

### A nonpartisan retention election is held.

If majority of votes cast on the issue approve retention, the appointee serves a regular eight year term.

If majority of the votes cast are not in favor of retention, office becomes vacant at end of term.

Governor must then nominate a person of the same political affiliation as the justice or judge not retained.

- Current workload calculations are based on July 1, 2014 June 30, 2017 filings.
- Adjustments to case weights (minutes allotted per case type), day value (number of minutes available per day for case-related work activities), and year value (number of minutes available per year for case-related work activities) are made periodically by NCAOC in response to changes in law and/or practice.

#### Clerks of Superior Court

- 2007 National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2008 NCAOC conducted a 4 week time study, resulting in adjustments to case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2010 To align with the National Center for State Courts workload study of assistant district attorneys and district attorney legal assistants (then titled victim witness/legal assistants), NCAOC converted clerk filings counts and case weights to a same-day defendant based count to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices.
- 2012 NCAOC, after consultation with the Clerk Resource Committee and Clerk Executive Committee, updated the clerk workload formula by adding allotted time per case for the following case-related activities:
  - o District Civil reviewing filings to determine if new motions fee is applicable
  - Superior Civil reviewing filings to determine if new motions fee is applicable
  - Receipts Written collecting motions fee on relevant filings
  - Special Proceedings determining new 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> required foreclosure findings; running criminal background check for name change cases; conducting additional contested hearings
  - Estates conducting increase in contested estates hearings
  - Juvenile entering required data into JWise
  - District Criminal sending notices and making phone calls related to bond forfeiture motions to set aside
  - o Superior Criminal sending notices and making phone calls related to bond forfeiture motions to set aside
- 2014 NCAOC, after consultation with the Clerk Resource Committee and Clerk Executive
   Committee, updated the clerk workload formula by adding allotted time per case for Special



Proceedings due to concealed carry permit checks that require a review of involuntary commitments records. Analysis of the impact of the following were determined to be largely offsetting (some increased time and some saved timed): payNCticket, eCitation, and on-bench time reporting.

- 2016 NCAOC, after consultation with the Clerk Resource Committee and Clerk Executive Committee, updated the clerk workload formula by making minor adjustments to day values and by adding allotted time per case for the following case-related activities:
  - o Criminal Superior completing additional required data entry into CCIS-CC.
  - o Criminal District completing additional required data entry into CCIS-CC.

#### District Court Judges

- 2007 National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2010 To align with the National Center for State Courts workload study of assistant district attorneys and district attorney legal assistants (then titled victim witness/legal assistants), NCAOC converted district court judge filings counts and case weights to a same-day defendant based count to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices. Also, minor adjustments were made to day value after consultation with a committee of the Association of District Court Judges.
- 2017 NCAOC, after consultation with a committee of the Association of District Court Judges, increased the time allotted for impaired driving cases to reflect the increased complexity of those cases.

#### Magistrates

- 2007 National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2010 To align with the National Center for State Courts workload study of assistant district attorneys and district attorney legal assistants (then titled victim witness/legal assistants), NCAOC converted magistrate filings counts and case weights to a same-day defendant based count to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices.

### Assistant District Attorneys and District Attorney Legal Assistants


- 2010 National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values for assistant district attorneys and district attorney legal assistants (then titled victim witness/legal assistants). The National Center for State Courts utilized a same-day defendant count for filings to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices.
- 2012 NCAOC, at the request of the Conference of District Attorneys, adjusted the calculated need of assistant district attorneys to provide additional resources for supervision of assistant district attorneys and support staff in offices with a need of at least 7 assistant district attorneys. Additional supervision resources were added in offices with a need of at least 24 assistant district attorneys.

2011 – National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values. The National Center for State Courts utilized a same-day defendant count for filings to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices.



# Superior Court Districts, Judicial Divisions, Prosecutorial Districts, District Court Districts






# G.S. 7A-41, Superior Court, Effective 1/1/19






# G.S. 7A-133, District Court, Effective 1/1/19




# G.S. 7A-60, Prosecutorial Districts, Effective 1/1/19



# G.S. 7A-41, Judicial Divisions, Effective 1/1/19









# H717, 2017 Session, 5th Ed, District Court




# H717, 2017 Session, 5th Ed, Prosecutorial Districts






# Draft Plan from Select Committee Chairs - Corrected - Combined

# Judicial Branch Workload Formulas Developed by National Center for State Courts

January 2018

- All workload formulas are updated annually based on the most recent three fiscal years of filings.
- Current workload calculations are based on July 1, 2014 June 30, 2017 filings.
- Adjustments to case weights (minutes allotted per case type), day value (number of minutes available per day for case-related work activities), and year value (number of minutes available per year for case-related work activities) are made periodically by NCAOC in response to changes in law and/or practice.

#### Clerks of Superior Court

- 2007 National Center for State Courts report set case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2008 NCAOC conducted a 4 week time study, resulting in adjustments to case weights, day values, and year values.
- 2010 To align with the National Center for State Courts workload study of assistant district attorneys and district attorney legal assistants (then titled victim witness/legal assistants), NCAOC converted clerk filings counts and case weights to a same-day defendant based count to normalize the data among counties with varying data entry practices.
- 2012 NCAOC, after consultation with the Clerk Resource Committee and Clerk Executive Committee, updated the clerk workload formula by adding allotted time per case for the following case-related activities:
  - o District Civil reviewing filings to determine if new motions fee is applicable
  - o Superior Civil reviewing filings to determine if new motions fee is applicable
  - Receipts Written collecting motions fee on relevant filings
  - o Special Proceedings determining new 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> required foreclosure findings; running criminal background check for name change cases; conducting additional contested hearings
  - Estates conducting increase in contested estates hearings
  - Juvenile entering required data into JWise
  - o District Criminal sending notices and making phone calls related to bond forfeiture motions to set aside
  - o Superior Criminal sending notices and making phone calls related to bond forfeiture motions to set aside
- 2014 NCAOC, after consultation with the Clerk Resource Committee and Clerk Executive
   Committee, updated the clerk workload formula by adding allotted time per case for Special








# Joint Judicial Committee - Option A, Superior Court





### Joint Judicial Committee - Option A, District Court






### Joint Judicial Committee - Option A, Prosecutorial Districts

# JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON JUDICIAL REFORM AND REDISTRICTING (2017) April 27, 2018 Room 643 of the Legislative Office Building

The Joint Select Committee on Judicial Reform and Redistricting (2017) met on Friday, April 27, 2018 at 9:45 AM. The meeting was held in Room 643 of the Legislative Office Building. Members present were: Senators Bishop, Daniel, Barrett, Blue, Ford, Hise, McKissick, Newton, Randleman, Sanderson and Van Duyn; Representatives Burr, Lewis, Blust, Davis, Grange, Destin Hall, Jackson, John, Jordan, Reives, Richardson and Rogers.

Senator Warren Daniel presided. He welcomed members and visitors, introduced the Sergeant-at-Arms and announced there would be no votes taken in meeting. He then recognized Representative Burr to give an overview of the most recent judicial redistricting proposals and incumbency data. (Map Options A, B and C and incumbency data attached and made a part of the Minutes.)

Representative Burr stated that Options A, B and C maps accompany the incumbency data integrated into the three options. The data was based on the addresses received from the Administrative Office of the Courts and prepared by staff. He requested members review and report to staff any incorrect information for their districts. He explained the way to interrupt the data and changes that had been made from prior recommendations. He stated maps will continue to update, making investments in each of the respective judicial districts to provide resources needed. He then asked for questions.

Representative John questioned if Wake County judges could not leave things as they are, did they choose Options B or C. Representative Burr answered that he worked with the Wake County delegation who brought forth and supported this proposal.

Senator McKissick asked for a document to summarize differences between plans. Senator Daniel asked staff to prepare a list to show which districts and sub-districts had changed and resources used to produce those changes. Senator McKissick asked if compactness was ever a criteria and what variables were identified to help determine how to draw the maps. Representative Burr answered the focus was on correcting the imbalance in election sub-districts that existed, along with superior court sub-districts in urban counties, making populations balanced to bring more in line with the Blankenship case. He worked within boundaries of the precincts in place. Information gathered from judges in the less populated districts indicated they were able to handle changes in maps if given the resources needed, which had been done.



Senator McKissisk asked if this proposal could wait for the next census. Representative Burr answered it was up to the General Assembly to decide, but the investments made in these options are needed. Senator McKissisk requested stat packs for the most recent changes and Senator Daniel stated they were available online.

Representative Jackson requested a fiscal note and was told by William Childs, Fiscal Research, there was a fiscal note for some of the language in HB717 and that he would provide a fiscal note for these changes within a week. Representative Jackson asked why Wake County would receive two judges, instead of one, which was originally shown. Representative Burr explained the growth of Wake County shows the need for two judges and the seat would be added in two years. Representative Jackson asked how many superior court judges are currently being added in plans B or C across the state. Senator Daniel deferred to staff for the answer.

Senator Hise commented on a question asked earlier about census and that it is conducted once every ten years, and every two years estimates are given on how population is expected to grow. It is never exact until it conducts another census which will be in 2020. The General Assembly would not receive the census data until 2021 to apply to maps.

Senator Ford asked what considerations were given when creating the districts for incumbency in Mecklenburg County Superior Court Options B and C. Representative Burr stated that balancing those populations and moving toward single member districts was developed to try to eliminate double bunking. Judges living in same neighborhoods and precincts made it difficult. He encouraged Senator Ford to present another draft to be considered. Senator Ford asked what to expect about the terms for judges. Representative Burr answered the 2018 elections and beyond depend on what recommendations come from this Committee and the General Assembly in comings months. Senator Ford asked if a deadline for making a decision on judge's elections had been set. Erika Churchill, Fiscal Research, responded that the ballots need to be set and printed by September 7 for the November general election.

Senator Barrett questioned Forsyth County's written material verses the Option C map as it related to double bunking. Representative Burr said the inset maps on the committee website would show a better map and he would look to see about making adjustments if this had occurred.

Senator Bishop was recognized to ask Senator Ford if he had received any recommendations for modifications to cure the double bunking in Mecklenburg Superior Court seats. Senator Ford answered he was gathering that information. Senator Bishop agreed it appropriate to make adaptions to accommodate those concerns and asked for input from the Mecklenburg community.

There being no additional questions, Senator Daniel moved to the next item on the agenda.

Representative Burr was recognized to present *HB 240*, *GA Appoint for District Court Vacancies*. (Bill and Summary attached and made a part of the Minutes.)



He explained the bill proposes to modify the existing general statutes on the appointment process for filling district court vacancies, giving the General Assembly the authority to make district court vacancy appointments.

Representative Jackson was recognized to provide a comment on the Bar selection process and questioned the General Assembly's ability to act quickly in making appointments when not in session. Representative Burr addressed the process in place for appointments during the interim.

Representative Reives commented on transparency and accountability in the selection process by the Governor verses the General Assembly and would like to go back to the Governor making appointments. Representative Burr responded the Bar and attorneys choosing a judge is not the same as having the public capable of having input through open meetings with the elected officials throughout the State.

Senator Daniel recognized William Childs, Fiscal Research, to provide an answer related to an earlier question from Representative Jackson for a fiscal note. He stated that without an introduced bill there cannot be an official fiscal note. Representative Burr offered to provide total numbers for each plan for additional superior and district court judges and ADAs. That gave information to see dollar amount for each of the proposals. Representative Jackson responded that travel costs for judges had been the reason for this request.

Representative Reives commented that he preferred the Bar having input on bench appointments and he had concerns that people would question transparency if the General Assembly became a part of the selection process.

Senator Bishop was recognized for a comment on lawyers picking judges and how citizens react negatively to this process. We must look at lawyers tacitly picking judges and just how much is being done in this manner. Election verses selection plans need uniformity and having one person picking the bench was not the best way.

Senator Barrett stated that improving the process of selecting the judges should be reviewed and this was a potential opportunity to improve the process. He asked for information on the history of how changes had been made over time. Senator Daniel requested staff provide statute that outlined the previous process for district court selection and the session law that changed it. Senator Barrett asked for the same on HB 241. He stated the process should have vetting of the local bar as well as the local representatives.

Representative Rogers commented on the smaller districts having one firm larger than others to possibly monopolize choosing every judge, if the process was bound to the lawyers and the Governor.



Representative Richardson suggested the process of how to handle district and superior court vacancy selection be done by the Courts Commission. He had issues with the way things would be handled during interim.

Senator Hise summarized the process that has been used in judge selections and stated that the writers of the Constitution gave the decision to the Legislature to decide the manner in which this process is determined. He stated the bills had passed the House and no bill introduction is needed from the Senate.

Representative John asserted the Commission on Administration of Law and Justice has been established and asked had they recommended a change in the appointment of district court vacancies. Representative Burr stated that in the Legislature was not bound by commissions, committees, boards and reports to propose ideas and legislation. Legislators are elected by the people to make these decisions. Representative John asked who had requested a change in this process and Representative Burr answered that citizens have requested changes in how judges are selected, not wanting a small group of attorneys choosing the judges.

Senator Newton commended Representative Burr and the House for making an effort in this direction. He stated citizens deserve the best in balance between the independency of the judiciary and accountability. House Bill 241 puts more accountability in the selection process by shifting the accountability to the nominating body. The Bar provides an important role. Legislators are more accountable to the people of North Carolina than the Governor due to frequency of their elections.

Senator McKissick asked if this process is the best way due to partisan makeup of the General Assembly when selections are made. Representative Jackson wanted language in the bill that would keep same party appointment when filling a vacancy. Representative Burr asked Representative Jackson if he thought the Governor should be held by the same standards and Representative Jackson answered that the Governor should follow the Constitution and authority that is given. He further added that judges had been nonpartisan until this bill.

Representative Blust was recognized and asked if the General Assembly had time to consider such a bill due to time limitations when in session. Representative Burr answered that the General Assembly meets often between sessions and the public can have input through their legislators and the Constitution states the General Assembly should determine how these vacancies are filled. The House has passed these bills and feels this is the action to take.

Senator Daniel stated that all arguments have been stated on HB240 that would apply to *HB241*, "Special Sup. Ct. Judgeship Appointed by GA." and requested Representative Burr describe the contents of that bill. Representative Burr stated the modifications of the special superior court judges, Article 4, Section 9 of the Constitution gave the General Assembly the power to determine the selection process of these judges. Since 2013 the Governor has been required to submit his nominations to the General Assembly for confirmation, and the bill proposed changes



of appointment authority be moved to the General Assembly. (Bill and Summary attached and made a part of the Minutes.)

Senator Daniel recognized Senator Barrett who commented whether the Legislature or the Governor chose the replacement judge in the interim, the same party candidate should be replaced, allowing people their choice in upcoming election.

Senator Van Duyn suggested an independent panel for choosing judges.

Senator Hise asked if nominations related to HB240 and HB241 would be subject to the veto of the Governor. Representative Burr answered that as long as the bill contained no other provisions it would not be subject to a Governor veto. Erika Churchill confirmed Article 2, Section 22 of our Constitution sets forth exceptions from the veto authority.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:35 A.M.

#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT DISTRICT COURT VACANCIES SHALL BE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 7A-142 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-142. Vacancies in office.

(a) <u>Vacancies Filled by General Assembly. – A Pursuant to the authority granted in Section 10 of Article IV of the North Carolina Constitution, a vacancy in the office of district judge shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the Governor. General Assembly.</u>

(b) Bar Nominations. — The bar of the judicial district, as defined in G.S. 84-19, shall nominate five persons who are residents of the judicial district who are duly authorized to practice law in the district for consideration by the Governor-General Assembly. The nominees shall be selected by vote of only those bar members who reside in the district. In the event fewer than five persons are nominated, upon providing the nominations to the Governor-General Assembly, the bar shall certify that there were insufficient nominations in the district to comply with this section. Prior to filling the vacancy, the Governor shall give due consideration to the nominations provided by the bar of the judicial district. The district bar shall submit nominations within 15 business days from the date the vacancy occurs. The General Assembly shall not be bound by the nominations of the bar of the judicial district.

(c) Session Appointments. – When the General Assembly is in session, the appointment of a person who is duly authorized to practice law and a resident of the district where the vacancy occurs shall be made by enactment of a bill. The bill shall state the name of the person appointed, the office to which the appointment is being made, the effective date of the appointment, the date of expiration of the term, and the county of residence of the appointee.

(d) Interim Appointments. — If a vacancy in the office of district judge occurs while the General Assembly is not in session, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate may leave the vacancy in place until the reconvening of the General Assembly or, after receiving nominations as provided in subsection (b) of this section, jointly submit the name of a person who is duly authorized to practice law and a resident of the district where the vacancy occurs to the Governor. The Governor shall then appoint the person no later than 10 days after the name has been submitted. Failure to act within 10 days as required under the provisions of the preceding sentence shall be deemed to be approval of the person, and the person shall be eligible to enter the office in as full and ample extent as if the Governor had executed the appointment. The Governor shall not appoint a person other than the person so recommended."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 240 would require vacancies in the office of district judge to be filled by appointment of the General Assembly.

CURRENT LAW: Article IV, Section 10 of the North Carolina Constitution provides that vacancies in the office of district judge shall be filled for the unexpired term "in the manner provided by law." Pursuant to G.S. 7A-142, vacancies in the office of district judge are filled by appointment of the Governor. The bar of the judicial district in which the vacancy occurs is required to nominate five people who are residents of the judicial district and are duly authorized to practice law, unless it certifies that there were insufficient nominations to do so. The Governor must give "due consideration" to these nominees but is not required to appoint one of them. There currently is no time limit within which the district bar must submit nominations for the Governor's consideration.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** House Bill 240 would amend G.S. 7A-142 to require vacancies in the office of district judge to be filled by appointment of the General Assembly. The district bar would be required to submit its nominations to the General Assembly within 15 business days after the vacancy occurs. The General Assembly would not be bound by the district bar's nominations.

If the vacancy occurs when the General Assembly is in session, the appointment would be made by enactment of a bill stating the name of the person appointed, the office to which the appointment is being made, the effective date of the appointment, the date of expiration of the term, and the county of residence of the appointee.

If the vacancy occurs when the General Assembly is not in session, then the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate could either:

- 1. Leave the vacancy unfilled until the reconvening of the General Assembly; or
- 2. Jointly submit the name of a nominee to the Governor, after receiving the district bar's nominations.

In the latter event, the Governor would be required to appoint the nominee within 10 days. The Governor's failure to act within this allotted time would be deemed to be approval of the nominee, who would be eligible to enter office in the same manner as if the Governor had appointed the nominee.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act would be effective when it becomes law.

#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT SPECIAL SUPERIOR COURT JUDGES ARE APPOINTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 7A-45.1 reads as rewritten:

#### "§ 7A-45.1. Special judges.

- (a) Effective November 1, 1993, the Governor may appoint two special superior court judges to serve terms expiring September 30, 2000. Effective October 1, 2000, one of those positions is abolished. Successors to the special superior court judge appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to a five year term. The General Assembly may appoint special superior court judges to serve a five-year term when any of the following occurs for the special superior court judges holding office on or after January 1, 2017:
  - (1) Retirement of the incumbent judge.
  - (2) Resignation of the incumbent judge.
  - (3) Removal from office of the incumbent judge.
  - (4) Death of the incumbent judge.
  - (5) Expiration of the term of the incumbent judge.
  - (6) For any other reason that causes a judgeship to become vacant.

A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.

- (a1) Effective October 1, 1995, the Governor may appoint two special superior court judges to serve terms expiring September 30, 2000. Successors to the special superior court judges appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a2) Effective December 15, 1996, the Governor may appoint four special superior court judges to serve terms expiring five years from the date that each judge takes office. Successors to the special superior court judges appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a3) Effective December 15, 1998, the Governor may appoint a special superior court judge to serve a term expiring five years from the date that judge takes office. Successors to the special



superior court judge appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.

- (a4) Effective October 1, 1999, the Governor may appoint four special superior court judges to serve terms expiring five years from the date that each judge takes office. Successors to the special superior court judges appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a5) Effective October 1, 2001, the Governor may appoint a special superior court judge to serve a term expiring five years from the date that judge takes office. Successors to the special superior court judge appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a6) Effective December 1, 2004, the Governor may appoint a special superior court judge to serve a term expiring five years from the date that each judge takes office. Successors to the special superior court judge appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a7) Effective January 1, 2008, the Governor may appoint two special superior court judges to serve terms expiring five years from the date that each judge takes office. Successors to the special superior court judges appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to five year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district.
- (a8) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the four special superior court judgeships held as of April 1, 2014, by judges whose terms expire on April 29, 2015, October 20, 2015, and December 31, 2017, and the two special superior court judgeships held as of April 1, 2015, by judges whose terms expire January 26, 2016, are abolished when any of the following first occurs:
  - (1) Retirement of the incumbent judge.
  - (2) Resignation of the incumbent judge.
  - (3) Removal from office of the incumbent judge.
  - (4) Death of the incumbent judge.
  - (5) Expiration of the term of the incumbent judge.
- (a9) Effective upon the retirement, resignation, removal from office, death, or expiration of the term of the special superior court judge held as of April 1, 2014, by the judge whose term expires on April 29, 2015, a new special superior court judgeship shall be created and filled through the procedure for nomination and confirmation provided for in subsection (a10) of this section.

Prior to submitting a nominee for the judgeship created under this subsection to the General Assembly for confirmation, the Governor shall consult with the Chief Justice to ensure that the person nominated to fill this judgeship has the requisite expertise and experience to be designated by the Chief Justice as a business court judge under G.S. 7A-45.3, and the Chief Justice is requested to designate this judge as a business court judge.

(a10) Except for the judgeships abolished pursuant to subsection (a8) of this section, upon the retirement, resignation, removal from office, death, or expiration of the term of any special superior court judge on or after September 1, 2014, each judgeship shall be filled for a full

42 43 44 five year term beginning upon the judge's taking office according to the following procedure prescribed by the General Assembly pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(1) of the North Carolina Constitution. As each judgeship becomes vacant or the term expires, the Governor General Assembly shall submit the name of a nominee for that judgeship to the General Assembly for confirmation by ratified joint resolution. Upon each such confirmation, the Governor shall appoint the confirmed nominee to that judgeship.appoint a new special superior court judge to fill that

However, upon the failure of the Governor to submit the name of a nominee within 90 days of the occurrence of the vacancy or within 90 days of the expiration of the judge's term, as applicable, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives jointly shall submit the name of a nominee to the General Assembly. The appointment Appointments shall then be made by enactment of a bill. The bill shall state the name of the person being appointed, the office to which the appointment is being made, and the county of residence of the appointee.

The Governor may withdraw any nomination prior to it failing on any reading, and in case of such withdrawal the Governor shall submit a different nomination within 45 days of withdrawal. If a nomination shall fail any reading, the Governor shall submit a different nomination within 45 days of such failure. In either case of failure to submit a new nomination within 45 days, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall submit the name of a nominee to the General Assembly under the procedure provided in the preceding paragraph.

No person shall occupy a special superior court judgeship authorized under this subsection in any capacity, or have any right to, claim upon, or powers of those judgeships, unless that person's nomination has been confirmed by the General Assembly by joint resolution or appointed through the enactment of a bill upon the failure of the Governor to submit a nominee. Until confirmed by the General Assembly and appointed by the Governor, or appointed by the General Assembly upon the failure of the Governor to appoint a nominee, and qualified by taking the oath of office, a nominee is neither a de jure nor a de facto officer.

- (a11) The Chief Justice is requested, pursuant to the authority under G.S. 7A-45.3 to designate business court judges, to maintain at least five business court judgeships from among the special superior court judgeships authorized under this section.
- A special judge is subject to removal from office for the same causes and in the same manner as a regular judge of the superior court, and a vacancy occurring in the office of special judge is filled by the Governor by appointment for the unexpired term.court.
- A special judge, in any court in which he is duly appointed to hold, has the same power and authority in all matters that a regular judge holding the same court would have. A special judge, duly assigned to hold the court of a particular county, has during the session of court in that county, in open court and in chambers, the same power and authority of a regular judge in all matters arising in the district or set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1(a) in which that county is located, that could properly be heard or determined by a regular judge holding the same session of court.
- A special judge is authorized to settle cases on appeal and to make all proper orders in regard thereto after the time for which he was commissioned has expired."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 241 would allow the General Assembly to fill vacancies occurring in a special superior court judgeship for those judges holding such office on or after January 1, 2017, eliminate the Governor's role in nominating a person to be confirmed by the General Assembly and in appointing the confirmed nominee, and repeal obsolete provisions relating to prior gubernatorial appointments.

**CURRENT LAW:** Article IV, Section 9 of the North Carolina Constitution states: "[t]he General Assembly may provide by general law for the selection or appointment of special or emergency Superior Court Judges not selected for a particular judicial district."

Pursuant to G.S. 7A-45.1, upon the retirement, resignation, removal from office, death, or expiration of the term of any special superior court judge, the Governor is required to submit the name of a nominee for that judgeship to the General Assembly for confirmation by ratified joint resolution. Upon confirmation, the Governor appoints the confirmed nominee to serve a full five-year term as special superior court judge. If the joint resolution confirming the nominee fails any reading, then the Governor has 45 days within which to submit the name of a different nominee for confirmation.

If the Governor fails to submit the name of an initial nominee within 90 days of the occurrence of the vacancy or expiration of the term, or fails to submit the name of a different nominee within 45 days after failure of any reading of a joint resolution confirming a nominee, then the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are required jointly to submit the name of a nominee to be confirmed by the General Assembly by enactment of a bill stating the name of the person being appointed, the office to which the appointment is being made, and the county of residence of the appointee.

BILL ANALYSIS: For a vacancy occurring in a special superior court judgeship for judges holding this office on or after January 1, 2017, House Bill 241 would eliminate the role of the Governor in nominating a person for confirmation and in appointing the confirmed nominee to fill the vacancy. The bill would authorize the General Assembly to appoint a person to serve a full five-year term as special superior court judge upon expiration of the term of the incumbent judge or upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the judgeship for any reason, including retirement, resignation, removal from office, or death of the incumbent judge. The appointment would be made by the enactment of a bill stating the name of the person being appointed, the office to which the appointment is being made, and the county of residence of the appointee.

House Bill 241 would also remove obsolete references to previous gubernatorial appointments of special superior court judge dating back to 1993.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act is effective when it becomes law.
