INTRODUCTION

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program provides assistance to local governments to improve deteriorating residential neighborhoods, support public services, install water and sewer facilities and provide infrastructure for job-creating industrial sites. The North Carolina Department of Commerce Rural Economic Development Division is responsible for the administration of the State CDBG program and administers the CDBG economic development program. The North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources administers the CDBG infrastructure program.

REOIREMENT

SECTION 15.14.(f) By September 1, 2015, the Department of Commerce, shall report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Fiscal Research Division on the use of Community Development Block Grant Funds appropriated in the prior fiscal year. The report shall include the following:

- (1) A discussion of each of the categories of funding and how the categories were selected, including information on how a determination was made that there was a statewide need in each of the categories.
- (2) Information on the number of applications that were received in each category and the total dollar amount requested in each category.
- (3) A list of grantees, including the grantee's name, county, category under which the grant was funded, the amount awarded, and a narrative description of the project.

2014 ALLOCATION

The State CDBG program received \$43,513,865 for the 2014 HUD program year. The North Carolina General Assembly allocated \$1,375,000 for administration, \$26,186,235 for infrastructure and \$15,952,630 for economic development activities. Table 1 below shows the allocation of funds from the 2014 HUD program year.

CATEGORIES OF FUNDING

<u>Infrastructure - NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources</u>

The CDBG Infrastructure Program provides assistance to local governments to eliminate severe water and wastewater problems with known health and environmental consequences. Activities include:

- the installation of new public water or sewer lines;
- the replacement of public water or sewer lines or appurtenances where the condition threatens public health or the environment; and
- improvements to water or sewer treatment plants that have specific problems such as being under moratorium or special orders of consent.

Awards are made by the State Water Infrastructure Authority based upon a set of priority criteria approved by the Authority. The priority criteria take into account the economic status of the applicants and the documentation of a critical need for water and/or sewer infrastructure.

The Division of Water Infrastructure received 119 applications for funding on October 2, 2014. The total amount requested was \$186,128,490. Fourteen grants totaling \$26,186,235 were awarded.

Economic Development -NC Department of Commerce

The CDBG Economic Development program provides grants to local governments to assist with projects that will create or retain new full time jobs. Funding for projects is based on the number of jobs to be created and the level of distress in the community applying for the funds. Sixty percent of the jobs created or retained in a project must be filled by persons qualifying as low and moderate income (LMI). A LMI person is defined by HUD as someone having 80% or less of the median income in the County they reside. A local funding match of at least 25% is required except in the 25 most distressed counties.

Funds within the economic development category are available to local governments to assist with public infrastructure and/or to restore a vacant building to economic use resulting in the creation of permanent, full-time jobs by the project company.

All 21 of the CDBG economic development program applications received were funded for a total of \$17,247,153.

Table 2 below details the grants awarded by category, county, grantee, grant amount, and project type for the period between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015. During the reporting period, funds were awarded from both the 2013 and 2014 HUD program years.
