The North Carolina Human Trafficking Commission (HTC) is housed within the North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts (NCAOC). Both entities have been in regular communication with the Office of State Budget and Management and the N.C. Pandemic Relief Office regarding transfer of monies within the State Fiscal Recovery Fund. The following are updates on progress since our last report:

Appropriations Act: Session Law 2021-180

The grant staffing structure through ARPA / SFRF funds consists of 1 Grant Administrator, 5 Grant Managers, and 1 Data Manager in total. Last quarter we added 3 Temporary Solutions staff to assist with the primary and secondary reviews.

16.20A & 16.20B Grants for Nonprofit Organizations Providing Services to Victims of Human Trafficking

Summary of Activities:

These 17 grantees have all been through 4 quarters. Two of the agencies will close their projects in 2024.

Given the limitations on Administrative Costs for 16.20, we are re-evaluating the remaining funds allocated for a Grant Manager position. Initial assessment indicates the administrative funding will not last the life cycle of the grant awards. The NC Human Trafficking Commission will seek additional funding in the next budget to ensure proper oversight of the funding continues.

HTC is completing the process to enable a Grants Management System to begin fall 2024.



The 16.20 agencies have been awarded a total of \$3,039,975.16 in funding from Section 16.20A and \$1,140,000 from Section 16.20B. The distribution from Section 16.20A shows that most agencies have received 50% of their allocated funds, with five agencies already having received 100%. Section 16.20B has also disbursed 50% of its funds, which aligns with expectations given the two-year performance period. Grant staff have received all reports from quarters 1 through 4 and are currently conducting primary, secondary, and final reviews. Next steps involve shifting focus to preparing for the closeout process with two agencies and scheduling necessary site visits. Implementing of the Grants Management System will greatly enhance our ability to track detailed spending, streamline the reports from agencies, and create reports on basic data. Our goal is to have the system operational by October of this year. The Grant Management System will be utilized for all SFRF funding.

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Haven House is in Wake County, Raleigh NC, the geographic center of the state, at the crossroads of I-85, 1-95 and I-40. Haven House services serves youth in Wake County, North Carolina. Our target population in the Wrenn House and Street Outreach programs may travel to Wake County from other North Carolina counties, or out of the state / country. Award Amount: S159,348.00 Description or program initiatives: This award is supporting our agency's capacity to strengthen our service provision for youth who are victims of human trafficking and those that are at higher risk for victimization due to experiencing homelessness and those who are on runaway status, we have been able to designate staff time to plan for and implement best practices around our response to victims of human trafficking. Award Amount: S208,664.80 Description or program initiatives: Trauma Case Management/Counseling and resources i.e., clothing, food, baby needs, etc. for them to get back on their feet. Description or program initiatives: S208,558.72 Grant funds were used to set up a residential program where women who have been trafficked can have a safe place to stay as they heal and learn new skills. Christian Recovery Services Inc. (CRCI), in a joint venture with our Stand Against Trafficking USA, will meet the needs of women, men, and children who have been trafficked in Brunswick Columbus, Pender, New Hanover, and New Brunswick counties. We will also work with survivors of trafficking who have been referred to us from other counties.

Open a Resource Center under the established "hub and spoke model" to meet the needs of trafficked individuals. In geographic terms, the "hub" will be created through the addition of 6000 square feet of space onto the recently opened CRCI Thrift Store to support survivors with a range of services, including medical care, individual and group counseling, job training and case management. It will meet the need for "safe spaces" for those escaping trafficking.

Description or program initiatives:	This grant has funded the provision of direct legal services and related victim support services by JusticeMatters to victim-survivors of human trafficking in North Carolina.

Location:	On Eagles Wings residential and community-based services initiatives are available to serve girls from all 100 counties. The services take place in numerous counties. This quarter has included survivors referred to us from Cabarrus, Union, Mecklenburg, Gaston, Anson, Buncombe, and New Hanover in NC, and York County SC
Award Amount:	\$208,686.98
Description or program initiatives:	New 2023 Kia Forte vehicle was purchased in June 2023 (to replace older Honda with high mileage) to transport young female survivors to medical-dental and therapeutic appointments, therapeutic recreation activities, schooling activities, and life skills program activities such as grocery shopping, banking, community service, and fun community activities to build a sense of community.
