A YEAR IN REVIEW



The North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS) has successfully been in operation since 2007, serving 821,507 student enrollments since that first year. Below is a snapshot of accomplishments, facts, and recognitions that made the 2023-2024 school year unique.

Celebrated 16 years of serving students across the state, maintaining a focus towards growth, equitable access, and continued excellence for teaching and learning while serving as one of the nation's largest state-led virtual schools.

Instructed over 53,600 student enrollments from approximately 32,239 students.

Veteran NCVPS Instructor, Patricia Lipsey was afforded the opportunity to mentor future teachers attending Valdosta University in Georgia through a joint program between NCVPS and the University.

Graduated 20 teachers from the Teacher-N-Training (TNT) Program which prepares educators to teach virtually for NCVPS.

Welcomed six new critical language coaches to work with students in our growing World Languages curriculum areas.

Canvas New Quizzes is a tool feature in the Canvas LMS that provides interactive question types to expand assessments for students. All NCVPS courses implemented the expanded assessment option.

For 23-24, six NCVPS students competed in the annual statewide virtual NC Science and Engineering Fair. NCVPS Instructional Director, Dr. Thomas Cooper has served as the Region 9 Director for the past three years.

In April 2024, the NCVPS Japanese Department held its annual Japanese National Honor Society (JNHS) virtual induction ceremony. Sixty-six new members were inducted at the ceremony. The NCVPS chapter tied with a school in Hawaii for the most inductees in the United States in 2023.

Welcomed a Southern Methodist University graduate student as the NCVPS Operations Organizational Leadership intern through the NCDPI Summer

The Arabic Honor Society recognizes excellence in the study of Arabic and its commitment to its language and culture. To be eligible for induction, students must have completed at least one year of Arabic

at the high school level, maintaining a final average of 90% or higher in Arabic I, and must be enrolled in a level II or III course during their junior year.

NCVPS sent 17 Arabic Honor Society cords to students, acknowledging their achievements. Congratulations to these students for this oustanding achievement!



On April 23, 2024, the Japanese Department held its annual Japanese National Honor Society (JNHS) virtual induction ceremony. The NCVPS Chapter inducted 66 new members at this

ceremony. In order to be eligible for this honor, students must have completed Japanese I and II by March with a grade of 85% or higher and their overall GPA must be at least 3.0.

JNHS inductions at NCVPS began in 2019 and to date we have been able to honor 372 students with this award. Congratulations to all of these students!



District Support:

Middle School IRT Synchronous Program Launches



The NCVPS In-Real-Time (IRT) program was designed to support instruction by providing a certified NCVPS teacher to work alongside a substitute or beginning teacher to provide quality instruction for students. The program model is a whole-class, middle school course, with required synchronous sessions with a NCVPS teacher.

The IRT synchronous learning program was piloted for 8th-grade core instruction in the fall of 2023 with selected schools. Course offerings were in 8th Grade English Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science. A total of 121 students were enrolled and participated in three synchronous sessions per week. Parent Orientation webinars were held, and training was developed for both teachers and facilitators. For more information about the program.




