ESSER EXTENDED LEARNING AND INTEGRATED STUDENT SUPPORT COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Extended Learning and Integrated Student Support (ELISS) Competitive grant program has been around for many years. The intent of this grant is to fund high-quality, independently validated extended learning and integrated support service programs for at-risk students, raising the standards for student academic outcomes. It is important to note that these grant funds are only available to nonprofit corporations.

During the 2021-2023 biennium, this grant program was funded with federal ESSER (COVID-19 relief) dollars. The final cohort of ELISS recipients funded through federal ESSER monies has concluded services. This report covers the 2023-24 school year, in which **no grants funds were distributed** under the authority of the governing Session Law/General Statute. ESSER fund availability has ended, thus no future awards will be made under this provision.

There is no data or information to report within the scope of this report and this marks the final report to be issued under this reporting requirement.
