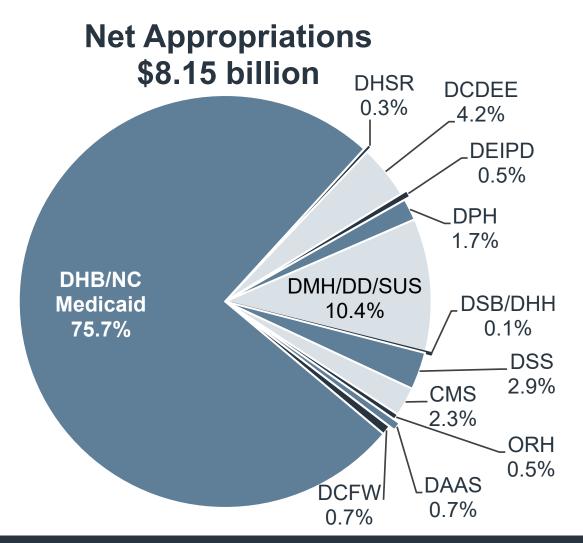

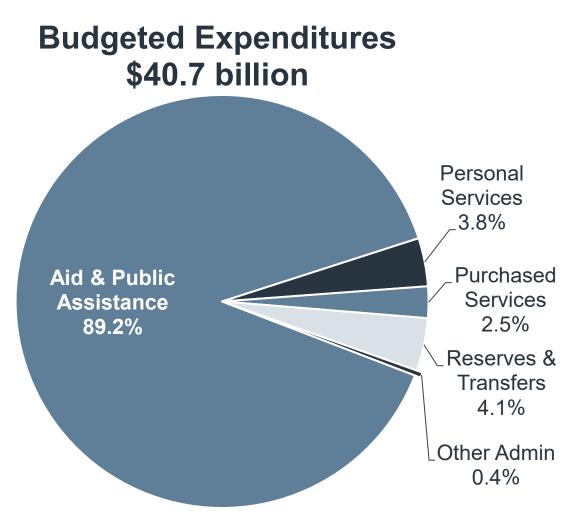

### Central Management and Support

Provides agency-wide administrative support to DHHS divisions and offices:

#### Office of Rural Health

Supports equitable access to health care in rural and underserved communities through the following programs:

- Provider Placement Services
- Rural Health Operations
- Community Health Grants
- Farmworker Health Program
- Health IT and Telehealth

- Rural Hospital Program
- Analytics and Innovation
- Medication Assistance Program
- NC Statewide Telepsychiatry Program

### Division of Aging and Adult Services

Administers and provides oversight of programs and services for elderly and disabled adults and their caretakers.

- Programs and services:
  - Home & community-based services
  - Rental assistance for individuals with disabilities (Key Program)
  - Long Term Care (LTC)
     Ombudsman Program

- State/County Special Assistance
- Adult protective services and guardianship
- Caregiver support

### Division of Child and Family Well-Being

Launched in 2022 to coordinate the following existing programs within DHHS that address the health and well-being of children and families:

- Food and nutrition programs
- Child behavioral health programs
- School and community health programs
- Early Intervention Program/Infant Toddler Program

### Division of Child Development and Early Education

- Supports early childhood services:
  - Regulates and licenses all child care facilities, including child care centers and family child care homes
  - Administers Child Care Subsidy and NC Pre-K

Budget includes funding for Smart Start, which is a public/private partnership of local nonprofit agencies who coordinate early education services for families with children between the ages of 0-5

### Division of Employment and Independence for People with Disabilities

Promotes employment and independence for persons with physical, mental, or cognitive disabilities through the following programs and services:

- Career counseling
- Transportation
- Education and career training
- Other support services

- Independent living services
- Assistive technology
- Job placement assistance
- Pre-employment support for adolescents and young adults

#### Division of Health Benefits

DHB was created as part of Medicaid Transformation (SL 2015-245) and operates the State Medicaid program

- Medicaid is an entitlement program that pays healthcare costs for low-income families, children, adults, elderly, and disabled
- Eligibility is determined by income, assets, age, and disability status
- Medicaid is the largest program in the State with more than \$30 billion in total spending
- Program costs are shared by the State and federal government
  - The federal match rate for the traditional Medicaid population is approximately 65%; the State share is supported with General Funds and receipts
  - The federal match rate for the expansion population is 90%; the State share is receipt-supported

### Division of Health Service Regulation

Establishes and enforces the regulation of health facilities through the following functions:

- Medical facilities planning Certificate of Need
- Licensure, regulation, and inspection of health facilities
- Radiation safety
- Oversite of nurse aide personnel education and credentialing
- Office of Emergency Medical Services

### Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Use Services

Provides support and services for individuals with:

- Mental illness
- Intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD)
- Alcohol and substance use disorders
- Traumatic brain injuries (TBIs)

Oversees and monitors 4 Local Management Entities/ Managed Care Organizations (LME/MCOs)

- Responsible for management and delivery of community-based mental health services to adults and children in their catchment areas
- Core services: screening, assessment, emergency triage, prevention, education, and consultation

#### Division of State Operated Healthcare Facilities

Oversees and manages 13 state operated healthcare facilities that treat adults and children with mental illness, developmental disabilities, substance use disorders, and neuro-medical needs:

- 3 psychiatric hospitals
- 2 alcohol and drug treatment centers
- 3 neuro-medical treatment centers
- 3 developmental disability centers
- 2 residential schools

#### Division of Public Health

Oversees and administers programs related to essential public health services:

- Local Health Department Support
- Communicable Disease Control
- Vaccinations
- Epidemiology
- Environmental Health
- Chronic Diseases & Injury Prevention

- Office of the Chief Medical Examiner
- Oral Health
- Forensic Test for Alcohol
- Vital Records
- State Center for Health Statistics
- State Public Health Laboratory

#### Division of Services for the Blind

Provides the following services to individuals who are blind or lowvision to enable them to continue to live at home and/or in the community:

- Vocational rehabilitation
- Business Enterprise Program
- Medical Eye Care Program
- Independent living services
- Pre-employment support for adolescents and young adults

### Division of Services for the Deaf & Hard of Hearing

Works to ensure that all deaf, hard of hearing, or deaf-blind North Carolinians have the means to communicate their needs and to receive information easily and effectively through the following services:

- Captionist and relay operators
- Domestic violence resources
- Emergency preparedness
- Technical assistance for agencies and businesses
- Sign language interpreters
- Assistive technology

#### Division of Social Services

Oversees and assists the delivery of services and benefits to children and families through the 100 county departments of social services, including:

- Child Welfare Services
- Child Support Services
- Work First Family Assistance
- Low Income Energy Assistance
- Refugee Services
