## CMS Overview: DHHS Campus Relocation






- July 2015 The State sells the Dix campus to the City of Raleigh.





## CMS 2023-25 Fiscal Biennium Significant Budget Actions

- S.L. 2023-134 (2023 Appropriations Act)
  - \$15.6 M recurring to the Transitions to Community Living Initiative (TCLI)
  - \$1 M recurring for cyber and information security tools and resources
  - Eliminated \$10.7 M recurring used for competitive grants to nonprofits
  - \$5 M recurring and \$20 M nonrecurring (from the American Rescue Plan Act Temporary Savings Fund (ARPA TSF)) in the second year of the biennium for electronic health records for State-operated healthcare facilities
  - \$14.2 M nonrecurring from the Information Technology (IT) Reserve for data center equipment in the new DHHS headquarters
  - \$80 M nonrecurring from the ARPA TSF for 'Child Welfare and Family Well-Being' initiatives

# NC Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System (CCWIS)

Background

NC child welfare system is State supervised, and county administered

In 2015, a federal review of NC's child welfare system highlighted the need for a statewide, comprehensive child welfare information system

• "The lack of a statewide case management information system... affects the State's ability to readily identify the status of children, including re-entry, placement history, and placement goals...'

# NC Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System (CCWIS)

## NC CCWIS (NC FAST Component) High-Level Timeline


- 2016 Development begins; legislative intent is for the system to be operational by 2018\*.
- System is developed and piloted in 5 counties, with plans to rollout across the State by September 2018.
- 2018 System is expanded to 6 additional counties (11 total).
  - DHHS delays planned rollout based on feedback from the first pilot counties.
  - Intake & Assessment functionalities are redesigned and rolled out to the 11 counties.
- 2019 Intake & Assessment functionalities are deployed to 24 additional counties.
  - NCGA postpones deployment until July 2020 and allowed counties to opt-out of Intake & Assessment functionality (S.L. 2019-240).
  - NCGA directs DHHS to develop and issue a Request for Information (RFI) for improving or replacing the NC FAST CCWIS.
- 2020 DHHS reports on RFI status.

# Implementation Status of NC CCWIS (NC FAST Component)





## NC CCWIS (PATH NC) High-Level Timeline

- The NCGA directs DHHS to resume development and deployment of a statewide Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System and to release a Request for Proposal (RFP) to enhance the existing system (S.L. 2021-180).
- 2022 DHHS develops RFP, receives federal approval, and releases RFP.
- 2023 DHHS receives federal approval to award a contract to Deloitte to develop and implement a new CCWIS (PATH NC) to replace the existing system (NC FAST CCWIS).
- 2024 Project plan is developed, various technology procurements are secured, rollout schedule is developed.
- 2025 Intake & Assessment functionality rollout is set to begin in April.
- 2026 Intake & Assessment functionality rollout is set to finish in the Spring.
  - Ongoing Case Management functionalities set to rollout.


## PATH NC Intake & Assessment (I&A) Rollout



The 11 counties currently using the full NC FAST CCWIS component will rollout both the Intake & Assessment and the Ongoing Case Management functionalities in PATH NC at the start of 2026.

## NC CCWIS Development Costs - Federal Funding

- The Administration for Children and Families (ACF) matches CCWIS-compliant expenses at an enhanced rate of 50% if they believe that NC is complying with their enhanced standards.
- Since 2019, the ACF has been reimbursing NC's CCWIS expenses at the regular, non-enhanced rate of about 20-25%.
- If the ACF regains confidence that NC can comply with their expectations for the development and implementation of a CCWIS, the match rate increases to 50%.
- However, the ACF can also end or reduce reimbursement and/or enforce penalties on NC if they determine that NC is not complying with their enhanced funding standards.

## Takeaways

- DHHS's Central Management and Support (CMS) provides agency-wide administrative and support services to the DHHS divisions and offices.
- During the COVID-19 Pandemic, CMS's budget was inflated by substantial, non-recurring federal funding. Normally, a large portion of CMS's budget is composed of IT expenditures.
- The Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System (CCWIS) has long been an area of focus within DHHS. It was initially developed as a component of NC FAST, but it is now being developed as a separate IT system known as PATH NC, with current plans to begin a phased rollout in April 2025.
