Session Law 2024-53, Section 4E.1.(b) requires that, if a State agency determines that, due to the impacts of Hurricane Helene in the affected area, it is in the public interest, including the public health, safety, and welfare and the economic well-being of the citizens and businesses of the affected area, the agency shall delay the renewal dates of employment-related certifications issued by the agency pursuant to its statutes for residents of the affected area and delay or modify any educational or examination requirements for employment-related certifications implemented by the agency pursuant to its statutes for residents of the affected area. Section 4E.1.(c) further requires each State agency to report to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations on its use of this regulatory flexibility.
