RE: Request for consultation for Radioactive Materials and Accelerator Fee

Dear Commission Members:

The N.C. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) is submitting this request for consultation on a proposed rule adoption to the fees imposed on individuals registered or licensed under the N.C. Radiation Protection Act for radioactive materials and accelerators. The proposed rule, 10A NCAC 15 .1106, would increase annual license fees for individuals licensed to possess and use radioactive materials or accelerators. Accelerators are machines used to produce radiation. Both radioactive materials and accelerators are used in the healing arts and in industry for a variety of purposes. The proposed rule adoption is being published in today's edition of the N.C. Register (November 15, 2018) and a copy of the proposed rule is enclosed.

The Radioactive Materials Branch is part of the Radiation Protection Section, Division of Health Service Regulation, in DHHS. Currently, the Radioactive Materials Branch is operating at a deficit, necessitating a fee increase to cover its operational expenditures. The last time DHHS increased radioactive materials and accelerator annual license fees was in 2011.

Statutory Authority for Fee/Amount of Current Fee/Amount of Proposed Fee

DHHS is authorized to set these fees by N.C. Gen. Stat. §104E-9(a)(8) and §104E-19(a). §104E-19(a) requires that these fees provide revenue to offset DHHS's costs in performing its duties under the N.C. Radiation Protection Act.

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The proposed fee increase is a flat percentage of the annual license fees set by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). The current and proposed fees are demonstrated in the Table below:

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Explanation of the Need for Fee

North Carolina's Governor entered into an Agreement with the United States Atomic Energy Commission (now the NRC), effective August 1, 1964, to provide for the discontinuance of NRC regulatory authority and responsibility within the State. The Radiation Protection Section is the agency tasked with regulating the use of radioactive materials on behalf of the State, with its core mission being to protect the health and safety of the public and the environment from unnecessary exposure to radiation. Currently, the Radioactive Materials Branch of the Radiation Protection Section is spending more than it receives in license fees and has been for the last three years. The shortfall in income has been addressed by transferring funds from the Radiation Protection Section's Radiology Compliance Branch. This limits the ability of both Branches to provide outreach and other services to the public and is not sustainable for the future. This fee increase should provide sufficient revenue to fund the Radioactive Materials Branch for the next five years.
